As explained in a recent email to the Province, the Definitory decided that Friars Arturo Felix and Giles Gilbert will complete their academic and formation requirements for the priesthood in the United States rather than at the Seraphicum in Rome. These two men returned to the Province on

October 26th and are currently being enrolled at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein. They will reside at Marytown.

All of our other men-in-formation are keeping well and seem to be happy and stable in their respective academic and ministerial assignments. Our postulant, Jim Hoffman, residing in Ellicott City, shared that he is very happy with the SA/IC



program, the fraternity, and the ministries. Jim will

be in the Province, during the Christmas break, residing at Kenmore and Marytown.

Our two Australian novices, Alfred Soliman and Gregory Westenberg, are enjoying the novitiate with its many solitude. lectures. and opportunities for outside ministry. With the advice of the Australian friars, our Province Definitory concurred that both Alfred and Gregory should remain in the States after the novitiate. They will complete their philosophical studies in the two-year pretheology program at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein. After which, they

will most likely return to Australia to compete their theological studies for the priesthood.



Mr. Doug O'Brien, the Development Officer for Marytown and the Province, offered the Definitory an update on what he has been trying to do to promote the community (beginning with Marytown).

Australia

The Minister Provincial has traveled to Australia several times before and after was formally accepted as a Delegation under our jurisdiction (May 2012). Fr. Patrick has shared that the greatest need in Australia is a renewal of Unfortunately, fraternal life. in Australia (and elsewhere) our major worries for too long have centered on staffing. If faithfulness to communal prayer is a foundation in our fraternity and ministry, then other things will follow accordingly. After discussions with each friar. the Minister Provincial, with his Definitory, has made the following new assignments:

Fr. Adrian Robson: to be transferred to Kellyville as Guardian and Rector of the Shrine of the Unborn; to arrive at his new assignment by May, 15, 2013. His position as Rector of the Shrine will begin immediately.

Fr. Benedict La Volpe: to be transferred to Dingley where he will serve as Guardian of both Dingley and Springvale; to arrive by January 1, 2013. (Because there

will be only two friars in Dingley and two friars in Springvale, the Definitory has decided to have only one Guardian for both of these houses so as to facilitate fraternity.)

Fr. David Huebner: to be transferred to Dingley as Assistant Pastor; to arrive by February 1, 2013. He will also have a three-month sabbatical at Marytown between March 2-June 1, 2013. David will also participate in a month-long pilgrimage to Assisi in July 2013.

Fr. John Vayalilkarottu: to be transferred to Kellyville as Assistant Pastor; to arrive at by April 3, 2013.

Fr. Joseph Nguyen Xuan Truong: to be transferred to Springvale; to arrive by April 3, 2013. He will participate in a month-long pilgrimage to Assisi in July 2013.

Fr. Emmanuel Gatt: to remain Guardian in Wollongong.

Fr. Paschal Corby: to be transferred to Rome, Italy where he will continue his studies; to arrive by January 2013.

Br. Jack Mardesic: to be transferred to Brussels, Belgium; effective immediately.


Fr. Christopher Shorrock: will remain as Assistant Pastor of Springvale and will continue as Provincial Delegate.
