

#### A Word from Our Provincial

Dear Friars, Praised be Jesus Christ!

While I have been in Australia – being part of the Assembly, presiding over the funeral of our brother, fr. Anthony Zahra, and visiting the friars in their various friaries and ministry apostolates – I have been read-



ing the book: Forming Intentional Disciples, The Path to Knowing and Following Jesus by Sherry A. Weddell. She discusses tried and true ways of making disciples not only of people who have never heard of Jesus Christ, but also of lifelong Christians who know the story and message of Jesus Christ but who do not have a personal relationship with Him! She gives very interesting stories of men and women who are cradle Catholics, who know the Ten Commandments and the precepts of the Church, who attend Mass, sometimes even daily, but who do not have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

As we begin to reflect on our second step of our Province's Four Year Plan, Mission and the New Evangelization, I could not help but begin to reflect and meditate on my own personal relationship with Jesus Christ. If I am being called to go out and announce who Jesus Christ is, I first have to make sure I know Him and He knows me. Then when I proclaim Jesus Christ and His message, it is truly Him and His message that I am

announcing. All the studies of how people come to believe in Jesus Christ, and stay part of His church and mission, tell us that a personal relationship with Christ keeps them grounded and motivated in being disciples. If we, as men of the Gospel, do not stay grounded in Jesus Christ and His message then we no longer are seen as credible witnesses to Him. If we are no longer credible witnesses to Jesus Christ, then instead of building up God's Kingdom we are tearing it down by our lack of sincerity.

Mission and New Evangelization call us out of ourselves and sends us forth into the world, proclaiming Jesus Christ not only with our words but by our deeds and our own personal relationship with Christ! If we are going to make disciples of Christ, then people must see in our very lives that we believe what we say and that Jesus Christ has a daily impact on who we are as individuals and as Conventual Franciscans. People know whether or not we believe what we say and live what we believe. Isn't that what Pope Francis is calling all believers to do? To be authentic people, authentic witnesses, disciples, and evangelizers of Jesus Christ and His message.

All we need to do as Franciscans is to look at our long history of men and women who were authentic believers in Jesus Christ. From the moment that Christ spoke to St. Francis from the Cross down through our own time, we see men and women who are authentic, who know Jesus Christ and who are not afraid to proclaim Him, even in the face of persecution and death. Our very own brothers, Michael and Zygmund are going to be beautified in December in Peru because they were authentic, intentional disciples, proclaiming not their message or their importance but the story of Jesus Christ. Every day as we gather to pray together, may we continue to become intentional disciples of Jesus Christ proclaiming to each other and to the world the Lord's great love at work in our lives, and inviting His love to work in the lives of the people whom we are called to serve.
