A WORD FROM OUR PROVINCIAL



Dear Friars,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

As we prepare to celebrate another Franciscan Advent Fast, beginning on November 1 and ending with First Vespers of the Solemnity

of the Lord's Birth, we should go back and read what our Seraphic Father, St. Francis, has to say about fasting, prayer, conversion, and penance.

At a quick glance, the word penance seems to mean "extra" prayers, as well as fasting from food and drink; something above and beyond the normal course of following the Lord. Yes, St. Francis always performed extra forms of penance but when you take the time to read what he is trying to say to us, his brothers and all those people who want to follow him, is that daily we need to have an ongoing spirit of conversion to the Lord and His ways.

Every day the Lord wants to make His presence known to us; every day the Lord knocks on the door of our hearts asking us to let Him in; every day He nourishes us with His Word and His Body and Blood so that we can be His presence in the world, continuing His mission and spreading His Word.

One of the greatest obstacles in responding daily to the Lord's invitation and call is that we have so many distractions that vie for our attention. Some of these distractions can occur because we are involved in building God's Kingdom and spreading His Word. How do we make time in

our daily lives so that these obstacles and distractions do not lead us away from the Lord, but draw us closer to Him?

One way of staying close to the Lord and His ways is our faithfulness to our prayer life. Sometimes during a penitential season, instead of adding "more" prayers, why don't we make a more concerted effort in focusing in what we are doing. Instead of rushing into the chapel ten seconds before prayer starts, come five or ten minutes ahead of time so that we can be recollected.

Perhaps St. Francis speaks of penance so often in his writings because he knew how difficult it is to stay focused on the Lord and His ways. To walk the path of the Lord takes determination, focus, and the realization that the way of the Lord is a gift. And as with all gifts, to use them well we need to keep our hearts, minds and souls as free as possible from distractions and obstacles. St. Francis knew that conversion was a lifelong process; prayer, fasting and almsgiving will always be a part of lives until the day the Lord calls us home to His Kingdom.

What forms of penance do we need this year as we prepare to celebrate the Lord's Birth? How might the Lord be calling us to a deeper way of following Him so that we can be more authentic men of the Word, more authentic followers of St. Francis. Remember, brothers, that our acts of penance need to make us more loving and more joyful in the ways of the Lord. These days the Church has enough bad press! If our acts of penance do not lead us to more loving, more faithfilled, and more joyous, then they are not the way of conversion for us.






### Lighting the Dome Basilica of St. Josaphat
